Open access in programmes for natural persons

„The applicant undertakes to ensure **open access** to scientific articles created under the granted funds by publishing them in an **open journal** or making their final version available in an **open repository** (the so-called Author's Accepted Manuscript) or in the **published version of the publishing company** (the so-called Version of Record). **Open access** to the publication has to be ensured at the latest at the time of its publication (no embargo period). [...].

The Applicant undertakes to ensure **open access** to research data generated under the granted funds by publishing them in an **open repository** of research data, with preference to making them available under the terms specified in the Creative Commons Zero (CC0) statement.”

THE ULAM PROGRAMME

A GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR DEVELOPING A SCIENTIFIC CAREER



The Ulam fellowship has been a great opportunity for my career. I am now able to pursue my own research topic, which is not so common for young researchers, here in Poland. I received my PhD in physics at Gdansk University of Technology.

The programme enables foreign scientists who hold at least a doctoral degree, regardless of their age and the represented field of science or country of origin, including Polish scientists working permanently abroad, to apply for a scholarship and start cooperation with Polish universities or research or scientific institutes.

NAWA Preludium Bis programme



The objective of the programme is to support international mobility of doctoral students by enabling them to complete fellowships related to participation in research projects under the National Science Centre (NCN) in Poland PRELUDIUM BIS calls for proposals. The programme is a result of the agreement signed between NAWA and NCN.

Open access in programmes for institutions

„If a given article or scientific material is published in a journal thanks to support funded under a Programme, the Agency recommends that the Applicant without delay provide open access to the publication under a free licence [...] or at least to the preprint if the publisher licence does not cover the open publication of the final version of the published text. The specific requirements and arrangements for copyright and licensing to the Agency are contained in the Agreement and may be modified as needed by the Applicant with the consent of the Agency.”

The Polish Returns NAWA Programme

aims to allow prominent Polish scientists to return to their country and take up employment at Polish higher education institutions, scientific units or research institutes. The Programme creates the best possible conditions for returning scientists to conduct scientific research or establish their project group in Poland.

NAWA CHAIR PROGRAMME



The programme is addressed to Polish universities, scientific institutes and research institutes, and allows them to invite to Poland and employ, for a period of 36-48 months, scientists with outstanding international achievements, coming from various countries in the world, and to create project groups for them.

Research component in Polish Returns & NAWA Chair

The applicants are allowed to apply for a research component financed by the National Science Centre (NCN) as a starting grant to be used during the first 18 months of the project implementation period to cover the costs of basic research. The eligible costs comprise i.e. costs of publication fees for scientific articles and the costs of sharing research data in **open access**, according to the policy rules adopted by the NCN regarding open access to publications.



NAWA Urgency Grants Programme

The objective of the programme is to support the international cooperation of research teams or the international mobility of researchers in response to sudden, important unforeseen social, civilisation and natural events with global or regional implications.
